PRESS RELEASE

4TH FOLKESTONE ROTARY HALF MARATHON 27TH SEPTEMBER 2009

I am pleased to report we had a very successful day with 709 registrations that was an increase on last year.

Congratulations to all those who participated. This year I was particularly pleased that the course record has been smashed along with many other results. It is a fantastic achievement to complete the course either as an elite runner or a new participant to a Half Marathon. The purposes of the race are to encourage participation, assist charities, visit our district and promote good health as well as increasing the profile of Rotary.

First indications are showing the event has raised in excess of £25,000 so far and so it could be possible to double the amount on that of last year.

The event went extremely well and assistance was received with sincere thanks from members of the Folkestone Rotary Club, Hythe and Canterbury Sun Rise Rotary Clubs. Folkestone Running Club, the Cheriton Girl Guides, other running clubs and the local community also assisted with the event. I would also like to thank Shepway District Council, Folkestone Police and St John's Ambulance for their support.

The weather was fine once again and we have received tremendous feedback from the runners congratulating us for such a great event, by way of organisation, goody bags and encouragement from marshals. The winner was Michael Coleman – Medway & Maidstone AC, at 1 hour 10 minutes and 9 seconds who has beaten his previous course record in 2007 of 1 hour 11 minutes and 10 seconds. The first female home was Rosalind Kieran, from Herne Hill Harriers at 1 hour 21 minutes and 10 seconds, also beating the previous course record set in 2007 at 1 hour 24 minutes 28 seconds.
